Certificate Course in Theology (C.Th)

Total Credit Hours Required: 30

Program Duration: 1 year (flexible, self-paced study available)

Admission Requirements

To be considered for admission into the **Certificate in Theology (C.Th)** program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Have attempted Grade 12 or GED examinations (or an equivalent secondary school qualification recognized in their country) but did not achieve a passing grade.
- Hold a minimum of three passes in relevant subjects, including English Language.
- Be actively engaged in ministry as a minister of the Gospel and demonstrate a desire for continuing theological education.
- Mature candidates who are active ministers and recommended by their church or ministry will also be considered.
- Successfully complete an admission interview conducted by the university.
- All applications are assessed on individual merit.

Program Purpose

The **Certificate in Theology** program is designed to provide foundational theological education. It aims to equip students with a deeper understanding of Christian theology and prepare them for more effective participation in Bible study, church administration, and various theological functions within their ministry or religious organization.

Program Objectives

Upon successful completion of the Certificate in Theology program, graduates will be able to:

- Demonstrate foundational knowledge of the Christian faith.
- Exhibit a basic understanding of Biblical doctrine and the theological interpretation of Scripture.
- Understand the theological significance of the Bible in the Christian tradition.
- Cultivate Christian character grounded in Biblical principles.
- Serve more effectively in Gospel ministry and contribute meaningfully to the growth and development of their church and local community.

Associate Degree (Diploma in Theology)

Duration of course: 1 year (flexible, self-paced study available)

Admission Requirements

To qualify for admission into the **Diploma in Theology (D.Th)** program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Successfully completed Grade 12 or GED examinations (or an equivalent secondary school qualification recognized in their country) with a minimum of four (4) credit-level passes, including:
 - English Language
 - o Christian Religious Studies
 - o Two (2) additional relevant subjects
- Applicants holding a Certificate in Theology (C.Th) from an accredited institution may be considered for direct entry.
- Mature candidates currently serving in ministry, with at least three (3) credit-level passes including English Language, may be eligible for admission.
- All applicants must pass an entrance examination and a formal interview conducted by the University.
- Admission decisions are based on merit and a holistic review of each applicant's qualifications.

Program Purpose

The **Diploma in Theology** program provides an intermediate-level theological education designed to deepen students' understanding of core Biblical and doctrinal principles. It introduces learners to essential theological disciplines, including Biblical Studies and Systematic Theology, while fostering a comprehensive exploration of subjects such as the nature of God, humanity, and sin from a Biblical perspective.

Program Objectives

Upon successful completion of the Diploma in Theology, graduates will be able to:

- Demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of the Bible, including the Old and New Testaments and selected key books.
- Understand and articulate essential Christian doctrines and their theological significance.
- Develop a mature spiritual life informed by Biblical principles and spiritual formation.
- Communicate theological ideas effectively through both written and oral expression.
- Interpret the Christian faith within the historical and theological context of the Bible.

- Apply Biblical knowledge and theological insights in practical ministry within the church, local communities, and broader society.
- Write structured essays on theological topics with clarity and depth.



Bachelor of Theology

Program Duration: 3 years (flexible, self-paced options available)

Total Credit Hours Required: 120

Program Overview

The **Bachelor of Arts in Theology** is designed to offer students a comprehensive, Christ-centered academic experience. This program prepares individuals for effective service in the educational ministries of the local church, with a focus on areas such as Youth Ministry, Children's Ministry, and Sunday School Leadership.

Admission Requirements

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Successful completion of **Grade 12 or GED** examination approved for secondary school in the United States or an equivalent credential in the applicant's home country.
- A minimum of five (5) credit passes, including English Language, Christian Religious Studies, and three (3) additional subjects.
- Successful completion of the entrance examination administered by the Seminary.

Program Purpose

The purpose of the Bachelor of Theology is to equip students with foundational theological knowledge, communication skills, and practical ministry tools needed for impactful Christian education. The program aims to develop leaders who will teach, mentor, and nurture spiritual growth in educational ministries within the church and faith-based organizations.

Bachelor of Arts in Christian Education

Total Credit Hours Required: 120

Program Duration: 3 years (flexible, with self-paced study options available)

Admission Requirements

Prospective students must meet the following criteria to be eligible for admission into the **Bachelor of Arts in Christian Education** program:

- Successful completion of Grade 12 or an equivalent secondary school qualification recognized in their country (e.g., GED in the United States).
- A minimum of five (5) credit passes, including:
 - English Language
 - o Christian Religious Studies
 - o Three (3) additional relevant subjects
- A satisfactory performance in the entrance examination administered by the University.

Admission is competitive and based on academic merit and personal readiness for theological and ministerial training.

Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies

Program Duration: 3 years (flexible, self-paced options available)

Total Credit Hours Required for Graduation: 120

Admission Requirements

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Successful completion of the **Grade 12 or GED** examination approved for secondary school in the United States or an equivalent qualification in the applicant's home country.
- A minimum of five (5) credit passes, including English Language, Christian Religious Studies, and three (3) additional subjects.
- Successful performance in both the **entrance examination** and **interview** conducted by the University.
- Applicants holding an **Associate Degree** in Theology, Christian Education, or a related field are also encouraged to apply. All applications are evaluated on individual merit.

The **Bachelor of Arts in Religious Studies** aims to equip students with a deep understanding of the Christian faith, its doctrines, moral values, and practices, while also fostering an informed appreciation of other world religions. Master of Theology (M.Th.)

Program Duration: 2 years (flexible, with self-paced study options available)

Total Credit Hours Required: 40

Admission Requirements

To be considered for admission into the Master of Theology program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Hold a Bachelor's degree in theology, pastoral theology, pastoral studies, or a related discipline with a minimum of a Second Class Upper Division (or equivalent) from a university accredited by the applicant's national Ministry of Education and relevant regulatory authorities.
- Applicants who do not meet the standard academic requirement but have significant ministerial experience or related qualifications may also be considered. Admission in such cases will be evaluated on merit and subject to the University's discretion.
